Brookfield... The School

Brookfield is an 11-18 comprehensive school with around 1330 students including a Sixth Form of over 300, situated on the western edge of Chesterfield in a pleasant suburb, close to the Peak District National Park.

We have a strong and discernible ethos, that is reflected in our aims. We have the highest expectations of our students in every area of school life. The quest for academic achievement is a very significant part of what we do – with excellent results at GCSE and A level . However, the belief that we are here to develop the whole child is very important to us.

We aim to develop well-rounded men and women who have enjoyed their school life – and have the qualifications and the skills to go on and have success beyond Brookfield. We work hard to ensure that every student is happy, safe and successful.





Brookfield aims to be a school where commitment, participation, involvement and achievement are expected of all.

- A school where Learning and Teaching are at the heart of all we do. Where there is a high level of challenge in classrooms, but where there is still room for laughter and for fun. - A school that recognises mistakes as part of a learning process - a school where everyone has the desire to succeed but the courage to fail, and praise and encouragement are the natural currency between staff and students, students and their peers and staff and their colleagues.
- A school where students value and support each other, and regularly join together to help others. Where students are encouraged to make a positive contribution to their community.
- A school that is alive with creativity - sport, art, drama, music and song, language, experimentation, understanding, empathy, warmth and fun. A school that promotes the health and well being of all and the development of the whole person.

Learning

Learning Together

We are a community school, something we place great value upon, bringing students together across year groups to work and reflect together. The strength of relationships that exist between students and staff – something that has been particularly noted in both of our last two inspections – helps us maintain our strong school ethos and that sense of community.

We are a comprehensive school and proud to be so. We recognise that success means different things to different students and we look to create opportunities for all of them. We feel that that diversity is part of our strength and ethos. Each year group has a Head of Year and an Assistant Head of Year who work closely with students and parents and deal with individual concerns. The Learning Support team and our Learning Mentors work with students who need additional support.

Brookfield Community School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people and expects all members of the community to share this commitment.

Extending Learning

There are numerous opportunities for students to be involved in learning outside the classroom. They are given every encouragement to fulfil their potential in many different areas including musical, sporting and community work. We firmly believe in the education of the whole person and we seek to develop intellectually curious and socially aware young people.

At Brookfield we constantly encourage involvement and participation in all aspects of school life. There are many opportunities for young people to fully develop their potential through the many extra-curricular activities that take place. Brookfield has an excellent reputation for a wide variety of sporting and cultural activities, which complement academic success.

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Learning in Partnership

Parents play a vital role in the school, supporting their children in activities and events as well as at Parents' evenings. They receive an annual report but we also monitor progress throughout the year and communicate regularly by text, newsletter and via the school website.

The Brookfield Parents and Friends Association provides extras which would otherwise be beyond our reach. Over the years the association has funded a new minibus, redecoration and a new sound system in the School Hall and improvements to the Library.

There are excellent links with the community, including a wide ranging work experience scheme. Work Experience has also been extended with highly successful programmes abroad in France, Germany and now Spain.

Sixth Form students play a significant part in the wider life of the school. Many work with younger students and in partner primary schools, and are encouraged to participate in community projects.

The strong relationships built up within the school help to provide a safe, happy environment where all students can prosper. Year Councils and a whole School Council give the students a forum to voice opinions and concerns and to share in fund raising both for school and charity.

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Learning Environment

Brookfield is well resourced, with increasingly impressive facilities. A new Sports Hall was opened in 2006, which has created the opportunity for new activities in the PE curriculum, as well as allowing us to develop a full programme of Community activities. We are one of the few secondary schools in the County with our own swimming pool. In 2010 we also installed a new artificial grass pitch.

Every teaching space has an interactive white board, and the student to computer ratio is now better than the government recommendation.

Each year we try to further improve the learning environment for our students and we have an excellent track record in attracting funding to support these developments.





Continuing Learning

Brookfield has a large and vibrant Sixth Form of over 300 students, providing a high quality post 16 education for our own students and those from a range of 11-16 schools who apply to join us. The provision includes all those elements that are so much part of life at Brookfield. Examination results are excellent. Students are given greater freedom and responsibility within a caring and supportive environment. Experienced, committed teachers ensure quality lesson delivery and the monitoring of student progress.

Students are given every opportunity to develop as individuals within a strong community. They are listened to and valued as young adults preparing for the next stage in their learning and training. We look to the Sixth Form to be role models and leaders for the student body and take on many significant responsibilities.
