Dear Parent

Year 12 students have internal school mock examinations in linear subjects from **Wednesday 3 to Monday 8 May** and students will have study leave during this time.

AS Level examinations commence on **Wednesday 17 May 2017**. Each student who is sitting AS examinations has received a copy of their timetable and should check this carefully. **Study Leave** for those taking the AS examinations will be:

During study leave staff will run revision sessions in their usual lesson time with the additional Maths sessions indicated above. We strongly recommend that students take advantage of these. Please let us know if any problems arise during this period, such as illness or bereavement, to enable us to offer optimum support.

The Year 12 mock examinations and where taken AS examination results, will be used primarily to determine the predicted grades we give when students apply to university or college. These grades are very significant as universities will use these to help determine the suitability of applicants for the courses they apply for and any subsequent offers they may make.















After publication of the mock examination results all students will have an interview with subject staff to discuss their progress. If students have not achieved at least a Grade E in two subjects (excluding General Studies) support will be given to find an alternative course to meet their academic ability and preferred learning style. However, please be aware that legislation dictates that students must stay in some form of education or training until their 18th birthday. The options are: full-time education - e.g. at a school or college; an apprenticeship or traineeship; part-time education or training - as well as being employed, self-employed or volunteering for 20 hours or more a week.

Students who do not achieve at least a Grade E in General Studies will not be allowed to continue with this subject.

Results Day is Thursday 17 August. Students who sat AS Examinations need to be in school to discuss their results, or alternative provision if results indicate that continuing into Year 13 is not appropriate.

Students will not be allowed to re-sit Year 12 unless there are severe extenuating circumstances which prevented the student from achieving. If such circumstances apply please let Mr Edmonds know in writing before 12.00pm Friday 25 August 2017, to be submitted in person on 23, 24, and 25 August. All factors will be considered including attendance and effort grades in the previous year.

All requests to re-sit Year 12 will be reviewed by a panel made up of The Headteacher, Assistant Headteacher in charge of Sixth Form and a Governor. Students will be informed in writing of the outcome by **Friday 1 September 2017.**

In Year 13 we continue to monitor the progress that students are making. In addition to ongoing assessment there is a further mock examination period in December. After these examinations final decisions will be made regarding the summer entries.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support throughout the year and to wish the students well for their examinations.
