Dear parent/carer

I hope you are enjoying a restful summer break and looking forward to students returning to school next month. Staff across the school are planning for our full re-opening and are eagerly awaiting the return of normal school life. Following my communication to you in July, this letter is designed to provide you with further information regarding re-opening.

Staff at school have been busy planning a safe way in which we can support the government strategy that all pupils, in all year groups, will return to school full-time from the beginning of the Autumn term. We can assure you that the priority at the forefront of all our planning is, and will continue to be, your child's safety and well-being along with that of our staff.

Start dates

In order to ensure our plans can be put in place effectively, the start of the school year has been organised in the following way:

- Thursday 3rd September staff INSET (school closed for students)
- **Friday 4**th **September** school open to Year 7 students only. Details have been communicated separately to Year 7 parents/carers.
- Monday 7th September school open to all year groups.

Sanitation and infection control

We have increased the number of hand sanitiser stations within each block. Students should bring adequate water to school with them, as we are unable to use the water fountains at present. The use of face masks in schools is not recommended by government guidance.

If your child or anyone in the household develops symptoms of COVID-19, they should self-isolate and arrange for a test according to guidelines. Please do not send your child to school in these circumstances. If anyone in the household tests positive for COVID-19, please inform school as soon as possible. We will continue to follow guidance and instruction from Public Health England, and follow instructions in managing any confirmed cases of COVID-19.



School Day from September

We will be introducing a revised timetable and school day from September that, as far as possible, maintains the planned curriculum while staggering break and lunch times to enable year group 'bubbles' to be kept separate, but to still have access to the dining area and suitable social space. Break time and lunchtime provision

Food will only be available during the lunchtime period, and <u>not</u> at break. Students are welcome to bring in a snack to eat at break time. Lunchtime arrangements do involve two year groups at the same time, but that these year groups will use completely separate areas for lunch and social gathering. These areas are the Main Hall and the rear dining area. Sixth form students will use The Hub and The Hive.

Entry to school

To further minimise the mixing of groups, entry to school site by students will be staggered through different entrances (see table below). Different entrances will be staffed every day and students will be welcomed and reminded of expectations.

Limiting contact between groups

We have been asked to apply the overarching principle, 'to reduce the number of contacts between children and staff', whilst at the same time delivering a broad and balanced curriculum.

- Students, as far as possible, will be kept separate in year groups
- We have separated the school into zones for different year groups.
- For the vast majority of lessons, apart from PE, Design and Performing Arts, students in years 7, 8 and 9 will have their own separate teaching space. Movement between rooms will be minimised.
- Year 10 and 11 students will have their own separate teaching space. However, to maintain their curriculum, students will move for specialist provision such as PE, Design and Performing Arts.
- Sixth form students will be taught for the majority for their lessons in an identified zone, with some movement for specialist provision.
- Students in Year 7-11 will have their own identified area at breaktime for either indoor or outdoor break.
- Students in Year 7-11 will have a staggered lunch, but within the normal overall timings, to keep year groups separate.

We will operate in zones, where each year group will spend their school week together in a designated area. This approach is designed to prevent students coming into contact with other year groups, therefore reducing the opportunities for spreading infection, and enabling us to help track and trace should the need arise. The year group zones are as follows:

Uniform and equipment

Students should return to school in their full Brookfield uniform. They should bring to school their full PE kit. The letter of 17th July detailed expectations regarding uniform and equipment. If anything, we will have even higher expectations of our students. It is vitally important that behaviour is impeccable and students are aware of the expectations on them. Attached with this letter is a document outlining Student Expectations. I would be grateful if you could go through this document carefully with your son/daughter prior to starting back at school.

Extra-curricular activities

In the first few weeks, we will be unable to offer any extra-curricular activities beyond the school day, due to restrictions. However, once we have established a secure structure and routine within school, we will look at how we can safely re-introduce, across all year groups, important enrichment opportunities that Brookfield holds at the heart of the school community.

Everyone is very excited to welcome students back to school. We recognise that this will not be without challenges, but know we can rely on your ongoing support at this time.
