## SKI TRIP TAKES TO THE SLOPES

For a number of years the ski trip has shredded up the slopes of Folgarida in the Dolomites. In 2019 we ventured to pistes new!

Bormio is a town located in the Province of Sondrio, Lombardy region of the Alps in northern Italy. The centre of the upper Valtellina valley, it is a popular winter sports resort. It was the site of the Alpine World Ski Championships in 1985 and 2005, and annually hosts the Alpine Ski World Cup. Bormio has been the home of the British Ski Championships for the past seven years.

Bormio town boasts quaint, idyllic and picturesque sights and offers a



traditional Italian cultural experience. The 17th century town centre has narrow cobbled streets, grand stone facades and is noted for the presence of several hot springs that have been tapped to provide water to three thermal baths.

Sixty-one students went on the visit, 40 of whom had never skied before. Students had five hours of lessons a day with Italian ski instructors and quickly progressed off the nursery slopes onto the mountain. Developing *Continued overleaf*...
