We are extremely proud of our Sixth Form with its high expectations, academic standards and quality teaching. Our students are well supported to become confident, independent young people who have high aspirations and strive to succeed. Last year for instance 90% of pupils gained a place at their first choice university and 97% at their first or second choice. In addition to this a number of students secured Level 3 and 4 apprenticeships. We are also delighted that we have students progressing to Oxford University this year.

Brookfield Sixth Form is a warm and friendly environment. Students respect and support each other and have excellent relationships with staff. The Sixth Form team consists of a Head of Post-16, Head of Year 12, Head of Year 13 and a Sixth Form Pastoral Administrator.

The Sixth Form is also supported by Susan Sharp, the Director of Post-16 provision across the Redhill Trust.

The Sixth Form team, alongside our experienced tutor team, are able to provide outstanding pastoral guidance and support. Our aim is to ensure that every student leaves Brookfield having reached their full potential both academically and personally. Students are closely monitored and supported by us to enable them to not only achieve excellent results, but to also grow into a person who will successfully take their place in society. For the majority of students this will mean continuing on to higher education, although we have an outstanding careers programme and impartial careers advice available to all of our students.

Brookfield is one of the only schools in Derbyshire to hold the Careermark Platinum Award.

Students in our Sixth Form are encouraged whilst they are members of the Sixth Form to participate in and contribute to wider-School life by taking part in our extensive enrichment, work experience and other leadership opportunities. These opportunities range from being subject leaders to taking advantage of our many links with local businesses to get hands on experience and skills from the experts in their chosen career. Brookfield Community School?

Recently, Brookfield has made some significant progress in developing Post-16 facilities, creating an even better learning environment including free Wi-Fi for all students.

As part of this programme we have created a Sixth Form exclusive study area in the heart of the school. The area has different spaces to meet student's different studying needs, for example there is a silent zone and a quiet zone. This is a large, airy space overlooking the fields of the Peak District. It was designed and decorated by the students to meet their own needs. The study area also includes ICT facilities including printing facilities. In addition to this Brookfield Sixth Form students have access to the Senior Library during study periods to work in silence, again there is also ICT facilities and printing available in this area. Finally, for when students want to do group work or need a refreshment break, we have installed a new Sixth Form exclusive common room providing a more relaxed working space where hot food and drinks are available.

We also provide specialist areas to support technical subject areas including a Sixth Form student exclusive Art workroom as well as access to Textiles and Design Technology workshop.

Brookfield is centred on an ambition to be the best and that applies to students and staff. Our motto is "Committed to Excellence".

Therefore, even more important than the physical resources are the staff who work here, all of whom are passionate about giving you the advice and support you need to achieve your full potential. The ongoing support from teaching and pastoral staff is the most consistent reason that students give for joining our Sixth Form.

You will be treated as individuals in a more adult learning environment and will be encouraged to take more personal responsibility for your own learning, development and progress. We will however provide you with the resources and skills to become independent learners who can organise your studies and revision smartly.


High expectations

All students who do not achieve at least a grade 4 in either of these subjects at GCSE will be required to retake these in Year 12.

Entry Requirements

All students must attain five 9-4 grades at GCSE (or BTEC equivalents) with preferably a grade 5 in either English Language or Mathematics. Individual subjects will require a specific grade in a particular subject at GCSE (see course booklet).

All students will be expected to choose 3 A levels which they will study for 2 years (the exception being students who study 3 A levels plus Further Mathematics). During their course of study, pupils will have a regular formative and summative assessment, including formal mock exams. In addition students will choose to study an enrichment course which they will follow in Year 12.

All students will be interviewed by a member of the Sixth Form team. This will enable them to make an informed choice about the best subjects to suit their individual needs. Parents are welcome to discuss these choices with the Sixth Form team following the interview.
