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INTRODUCTION

GUIDANCE FROM THE SIXTH FORM TEAM

As a Brookfield Sixth form student, you are expected to take ownership for your own independent study and organisation. This can feel overwhelming at first as it is a big step up from GCSE study. This guide aims to help you by giving you general and subject specific tips on how to organise yourself and your study time so that you can progress and achieve your full potential. The three key elements to being a successful Sixth Form student are:

OUTSTANDING ORGANISATION

You will need:

- A folder for each subject with dividers and polypockets
- Designate an area of each of your folders to store revision materials for each topic you study
- A4 lined paper
- Pencil case with at least a pen, pencil, ruler and highlighters
- A subject course outline for each subject
- Write the date of your mock and real exams in the front of your subject folders.

SENSIBLE STUDY SESSIONS

You should treat Sixth Form like a job. When you are in school you should make the most of every period of the day, there is never a time when you will have 'no work to do'.

You will have study periods on your timetable that you should use productively to maximise your potential.

You should plan ahead for these periods to ensure that you come fully prepared with any resources you may need to ether complete homework or revise.

There are many places in school that you can go to study:

Location	Description
The Hive	Sixth Form exclusive quiet study space with support and some computers
The Library	Silent space with some computers
Empty Classrooms	If you find a classroom that is not being <mark>used, feel fre</mark> e to use it to study in as long as you leave it as you find it
The Hub	Sixth Form exclusive area where you can buy refreshments. This area is more informal and is ideal for group work or to take time out to recharge your battery.
The Sixth Form Art Room	Exclusively for Sixth Form Art students to use throughout the day.
Technology and Textiles	For Sixth Form students to use at times that are appropriate for the teaching staff throughout the school day.

You should use this time to:

- Complete homework and non-examined assessments
- Complete practical work in specialist classrooms for certain subjects
- Research your specialist subjects by using the sources provided by your subject specialists in this booklet
- Start your Reactive Revision (see below).


REACTIVE REVISION

The idea that revision is something that you only start when exams are approaching or when you have finished leaning the content of the course is a myth. The best way to nail revision is to start creating your revision materials as soon as you start the course by reacting to each lesson or topic by condensing your notes and starting to revisit them frequently. By doing this you will successfully transfer the information you need to remember in to your long term memory in time for the exams.

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An effective revision cycle includes the following elements:



MAKE

Once you have finished a lesson or a topic, you can use the following techniques to condense your notes and start memorising the material. When condensing your notes, don't fall in to this trap; instead only pull out the Key Information.


Some of these techniques lend themselves really well to independent study whereas some of them can be done in small groups. There is lots of further advice and guidance online about all of these techniques:

FLASHCARDS

These can be used in many different ways to capture key information or key terminology.

TURNOVER CARDS

Similar to flashcards, you write a question on one side and the answer on the other. You can then either test yourself or test with friends or family. You can make it more fun by playing games with it such as trying to make a line of correct answers:




MINDMAPS

Take a topic and visually display the key information you need to remember. Remember less is more. You should only include key words and phrases and use lots of colour and pictures.

REVISION CLOCKS

Similar to mindmaps, except you split the page in to segments of time to focus on each piece of information. This is a great technique if you find revision overwhelming and want to approach it in smaller chunks.

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BODY PEG / LOCI

This technique is ideal for when you have to remember a list of information. It involves imagining pinning items to parts of your body or a room to make it easier for you to recall.

BOARD GAMES

This is great, fun way of creating a revision resource in the style of a game like Monopoly or Cluedo that you can then play with friends and family.

MEMORISE

Once your notes are condensed, you need to keep revisiting them regularly to ensure that the information makes it in to your long term memory. The more often you do this, the longer you will remember the material for. You should never try and memorise information for longer than 20 minutes at a time.

PRACTISE AND TEST

Once you have spent some time memorising information, you need to test yourself to see what you can remember. This can be done independently or with others. This can be done by being quizzed on what you have learnt or by then attempting an exam question to see if you can recall the information that you have memorised. The ultimate test that proves that you have successfully memorised the information securely is when you can teach what you have learnt to a friend or family member.

A handy way of making you feel like you are making progress is by using Leitner Boxes. Get yourself three boxes, and number them from 1 to 3. Put all of your revision resources in Box 1. When you test yourself, for the resources you can recall easily, put them in Box 2. This means that you only then recall them on a Tuesday and Thursday. When recalling Box 2, put the resources you get right in to Box 3, this means that you only recall these resources on a Friday. If at any point you can't recall information from a resource in Box 2 or 3, move it to the box on the left and start the process again.





REVIEW

Finally, you need to keep an organised log of where you are at with your revision. This can be done in a number of user friendly, simple ways that you can be regularly updated, for example:
